



Essential Guide to Grant Applications 2018

What is it?

An interactive, innovative and free to attend three-day masterclass, funded and hosted by NIHR Research Design Service (RDS) South Central (SC), on how to write a grant application that is strong from a methodological point of view, reads well and presents a convincing case for funding. The course will focus on how to sell your research idea by:

- writing a convincing application with a good structure, flow and argument;
- presenting a strong methods section, including statistical, qualitative, health economics and Patient and Public Involvement (PPI) elements;

The course will cover important tips on writing, along with guidance on what reviewers will be looking for (including what they love and hate to see).

Through a series of presentations with accompanying practical sessions, attendees will learn how to make their research idea clear and compelling to reviewers, how to write a good case for support and how to demonstrate credible support.

One-to-one sessions with our expert advisers will also allow attendees to work through aspects of their own research ideas with our experienced methodologists and facilitators.

This exciting event will bring together researchers from across the South Central region (Berkshire, Buckinghamshire, Hampshire, the Isle of Wight and Oxfordshire) who are intending to apply to any NIHR or other national, competitive, peer reviewed funding programme in the next 12 months following the masterclass. - Showing reviewers you can deliver: the importance of a good case for support
 - Expectations and common mistakes in the case for support
 - How to present statistics sections
 - How to present health economics sections
 - How to present qualitative sections
 - Reassuring reviewers
- Showing reviewers you can deliver: demonstrating credible support

What financial support is there available for me to attend the course?

RDS will offer successful applicants a free place on the course which will include refreshments and Lunch.

<u>Southampton Academy of Research is offering bursaries to UHS employed staff</u> who are offered a place on the course to support release from clinical duties. Unfortunately, this does not extend to those who have honorary clinical contracts with UHS i.e. whose substantive employer is UoS.

What will the bursary pay for?

For UHS employed staff the bursary will include:

1. Up to five days salary backfill. Three days to attend the three-day course, and an additional two days to develop preparatory material so you can make best use of the time on the course e.g. undertake literature searching, drafting research idea.

Up to five bursaries are available, of up to £2,000 per person. In the event more places are allocated than funding available, the total funding will be allocated on a pro rata basis amongst applicants.

When will I know if I have a place?

Attendees will be notified if they have a place on the course by the end of Wednesday 5th September 2018.

What are the conditions of the bursary?

You will be expected to submit an application for research grant funding within 12 months of attending this course. Staff (team) attending the course will be required to submit a short report 6 and 12 months following attendance.
