The procedure you have had today is:

Suprapubic catheter (SPC) insertion

Suprapubic catheter (SPC) change

Aftercare

It's normal to see a small amount of blood from the catheter site and within the catheter bag. To help reduce the risk of an infection we advise you to drink plenty of fluid (one to two litres per day) over the next few days. A member of the urology centre nursing team will confirm with you how to obtain new catheter supplies.

Wound care

Following the initial insertion of your SPC, please check the wound site. If after **two days**, the site has no redness or discharge, the dressing can be removed. If however the site appears red and inflamed please contact your GP or district nurse for a review of your wound.

Removal of stitches

Please contact your GP's surgery to arrange for the removal of any stitches/sutures **seven** days from SPC insertion date.

Future changes

Your catheter will need to be changed in 10 to 12 weeks.

This will take place:

At the urology centre for first change, and then all further changes to be completed in the community.

At the urology centre for all changes.
