Transnasal endoscopy (TNE): throat spray aftercare advice

You have had a transnasal endoscopy (TNE) today: _____

A transnasal endoscopy (TNE) is when a very slim, flexible tube called an endoscope is used to look inside the stomach.

You have had a local anaesthetic spray to your throat and your nasal passages but have not had any sedation, so there is no reason why you cannot resume your normal daily activities.

Please follow the advice below carefully:

Do not eat or drink until _____

Before you start to eat a normal diet, you should sip some cold water to test that you are able to swallow normally:

- If you can feel yourself swallowing you can eat and drink normally.
- If it does not feel normal yet, you should wait another fifteen to thirty minutes and try again.

When your swallowing feels normal, continue your normal medication unless your doctor or nurse advises otherwise.

After the procedure, you may experience some windy, cramp-like pains due to the air we passed through the endoscope. This is normal and should settle within 24 to 48 hours. You may also have a sore throat. This should also settle within 24 to 48 hours.

If you cannot get through to either of these, or if it is out of hours, please contact the emergency department on **023 8120 6220**.

- give you an advice sheet on what you should and should not do
